

FGE/WFE/BRE Kit bash Two paths to follow-Depending on which car you want to build

FGEX/WFEX

- 1. Underframes Rebuilt & Sill steps Bolster to striker face is 5'-6"
- 2. Ends Added details
- 3. Sides/Roof Ladders & Grabs & hatch cover rests
- 4. Trucks Stock
- 5. Paint and Decals Which Era paint do you want

BREX


- 1. Underframes Fishbelly & Sill Steps Bolster to striker face 5'-0"
- 2. Ends Basically stock
- 3. Sides/Roof Ladders & Grabs & hatch cover rests
- 4. Trucks Andrews
- 5. Paint and Decals Which era paint do you want


FGEX/WFEX - Underframes


NEW CENTER SILL, CROSS (.020 X .125)

BEARERS (.020 X .125)AND CROSS BEARER COVERS (.010 X .080).

.030 X .030 LONGITUDINAL SUPPORTS ADDED BETWEEN THE CROSS BEARERS









FGE/WFE Ends


- A .010 x .060 to the bottom of the car side to simulate the side channel
- Add a .100 channel on top of the side channel at each end
- Add detail at coupler pocket, NBW castings over grabs to the level of detail that you desire.



FGE/WFE Sides

- The Accurail design makes it easy to work on the sides of the car.
- Caution if you use ink to color the side hardware make sure it doesn't run with the decal setting solution
- After stripping and repainting the runny part I managed to recover relatively well

- Detail Associates .015 x .042 brass flat bar
- 2. Evergreen .010 x .020 on top with cut out where hatch arm will sit












Painting and Decaling Speedwitch D 142 for FGE and WFE (Earlier cars) Speedwitch D119 for FGE (Later cars) Microscale for BRE 87-535 Westerfield D6002 for early WFE

Consortium Paint Schemes*

* Thanks to Bill Welch

Early 1940-1953 FGE (No herald displayed);

Paint car sides yellow (Yellow with a drop of orange mixed in)

Side Sills and sill steps - black

Roof and ends and kick boards under the door – Freight car red

Placard boards sometimes black and sometimes yellow

Hardware on sides; grabs hinges and steps – Black

Hardware on ends – freight car red most likely but possibly black

Fan housing plates – yellow or black

Lettering type "Optic"

"Ventilator and Refrigerator" were used on car side

Before 1940 and into 1944 no dimensional data stenciled on car

WFE - BRE Early 1940-early 1951

Both roads displayed their heralds on the cars

WFE Pre 1940 thru October 1942

WFE and BRE early paint and stenciling schemes





Painting changes starting in late 1949

Late 1949 thru late 1951

Hardware on car side painted yellow

Roof, kick board, side sill and roof Freight car red, roof maybe silver

Stirrup steps and trucks were black

"Ventilator and Refrigerator" still stenciled on sides

Late 1951 thru 1953 and beyond

Ends freight car red

Roofs red, yellow or silver see photos

"Ventilator" stencil dropped from car sides

Later into - the mid to late 1960's lettering style changed to Gothic
